Alejandra is currently an ambassador of the Society for the Scientific Study of Sexuality, a non-profit organization advancing knowledge of sexuality and communicating scientifically-based sexuality research and scholarship to professionals, policy makers, and the general public. Working with UI College of Nursing Professor Melissa Lehan Mackin and nursing PhD student Christine Haedtke, Alejandra is the first co-author of a manuscript in progress entitled *Perception of the college hook-up culture* in sexual minority women.
