**Part one:** Self-directed, online course and readings designed to help professionals provide their services in the most effective way. It provides 40 hours of online curriculum that you will be allowed 6 weeks to successfully complete. Upon registration, you will be emailed detailed instructions for the online course. *The online course will be open on June 24 and will close on August 3.*

**Part two:** 2-day live training/practicum in Iowa City on August 6 & 7 to be held at the University of Iowa College of Nursing, 50 Newton Rd., Iowa City Iowa.

#### **STATEMENT OF PURPOSE**

The University of Iowa College of Nursing *SANE Online* + *Clinical* training program is an comprehensive intensive hybrid course to familiarize participants with all aspects of the forensic and health care processes for sexual assault victims. This course, taught by experts in the areas of forensic nursing, law enforcement, advocacy and criminal prosecution, emphasizes the overall importance of the role of the SANE/SAFE and their role in the interdisciplinary Sexual Assault Response Team (SART).

Key competencies identified by the primary stakeholders of sexual assault education and standards provide the framework for this training. Participants will learn to apply the nursing process for the medical and forensic evaluation of patients who have experienced sexual assault. Enrollees will participate in a simulated forensic history, demonstrate speculum insertion on a live patient model and practice expert witness testimony in a mock trial as a part of the educational training. The participants will have a beginning understanding of the issues and complexities of the SANE/SAFE role.

Lead faculty for the online course is Linda Ledray, PhD, RN, FAAN, SANE-A. Dr. Ledray is a nationally/internationally recognized expert, researcher, and pioneer in the area of forensic nursing. Laura Johns, MSN, RN, CCRN, SANE-A Johnson county SART/SANE Coordinator and Pamela Terrill, MS, SANE-A, complements Dr. Ledray's content by providing the Iowa perspective. Other expert faculty will contribute their expertise to the interdisciplinary content.

#### **PROGRAM OBJECTIVES**

Upon completion of the offering participants should be able to:

- Describe the role of various health care, law enforcement and criminal prosecution personnel in working with sexual assault patients.
- Discuss legal and medical standards for the collection of evidence from a sexual assault patient.
- Examine sources of victim support and advocacy including crime victim compensation for sexual assault patient.
- Conduct a nursing and forensic history of a sexual assault patient.
- Identify ethical and cultural considerations in working with sexual assault patients.
- Examine components of accurate and objective documentation for the forensic medical record.
- Discuss the psychosocial effects of trauma on patients and caregivers.
- Demonstrate beginning competency in doing a speculum exam on a live patient model.
- Discuss sexually transmitted infections and pregnancy prophylaxis for sexual assault patients.
- Examine laws and legal processes pertinent to SANE practice including participation in a mock trial.
- Identify special populations and demonstrate appropriate care.
