CON Grant Writing Workshop – June 2017

The ONRS will hold its annual Grantsmanship Workshop in June 2017. This workshop combines morning didactic presentations on grant writing topics from experienced grant writers and afternoon, small group work sessions that are facilitated by senior faculty.

This year, we are considering dividing the workshop into two phases (each 2 days long): Phase 1 will be geared toward the early components of grant writing (e.g., specific aims, gap and significance) and Phase 2 will focus on later components (e.g., methods, approach, protocol development).
