NURS:3110 Healthcare Finance will be available online through the University of Iowa or on campus at the University of Iowa for transfer students who have earned admission to our program. Transfer students will be required to enroll and complete this online course the fall semester prior to starting their nursing education. Students will receive information about enrolling in this course when selected for admission. A transfer student could choose to complete this course on campus in a spring semester as part of the prerequisite plan (this would require an application to the University of Iowa and the transfer student should work with the Office of Admissions for guidance to the appropriate application.)

World Language

Further Transfer Guidelines

Students must meet certain [criteria](#) in order to be considered for Standard Admission to the undergraduate Bachelor of Science in Nursing Program. A combination of up to 72 transfer and current UI pre-Nursing students will be admitted each Spring semester through the Standard Admission process.

In order to be considered for admission to the undergraduate BSN program, students must have completed or be in the process of completing all listed [prerequisites](#). It is important to review the application timeline in order to verify coursework is completed on-schedule:

Application Deadline: April 1 (typically a student's second year) for start the following January. The College of Nursing application will be available December 1 to April 1.

Required by June 1:

1. Minimum 3.0 cumulative GPA
2. No lower than a "C" (2.0) in prerequisites and General Education requirements
3. To be considered for Standard Admission, applicants must have a minimum of 48 s.h. completed by June 1 of their application year
4. Natural Science Prerequisites: To be considered for Standard Admission, applicants can have no more than two natural sciences incomplete on June 1. All natural sciences must have been completed within 10 years of matriculation (enrollment) in the nursing major
5. Social Science Prerequisites: To be considered for Standard Admission, applicants can have no more than two social sciences incomplete on June 1

Required at time of starting enrollment in the nursing major:

1. A minimum of a 3.0 cumulative GPA
2. A minimum of 64 s.h. of completed course work (although a total of 67 s.h. allows the student to only have nursing major courses remaining should the student be selected for admission)
3. All natural science prerequisites have been completed within the past 10 years
4. All social science prerequisites must be completed
5. General Education Prerequisites (all must be completed before starting the nursing major)
6. World Language requirement must be completed

Admission to the undergraduate Bachelor of Science in Nursing Program is competitive. Please note that meeting these requirements does not guarantee admission. From the applicants who meet minimum requirements, those who appear to be best qualified will be admitted. Admission will be offered conditionally pending completion of all prerequisite courses.

The number and the quality of the applicants will determine the competitiveness of the applicant pool. Historically, students who have built a solid science foundation, who demonstrate the ability to communicate clearly, who have an understanding of professional nursing practice, and who have excelled in the prerequisite course work have had the highest probability of earning admission.
