Nursing degrees

BSN program – 4 or 4 ½ year program


- Direct admission 88 students admitted as freshman (goal)
- Standard admission 84 students admitted as juniors with a January start date

RN-BSN program - Online program, 8 courses

 Students have an associate degree in nursing from a community college and are RNs

MSN-Entry into Practice – 20-month program

- Students admitted with a degree in a field other than nursing
- Current enrollment 38 per class







Nursing degrees (continued)

PhD program – 4 or 5+ year program

- 6-7 students admitted each year
- Prepares nurse scientists

MSN program – Health Systems Leadership

Doctorate in Nursing Practice (DNP)

- Nurse Anesthesia
- Family
- Psychiatric Mental Health
- Pediatric (primary and acute)
- Adult/Gerontology (primary and acute)
- Nurse Executive







Typical BSN nursing class

- → 20% first generation
- → 8% men (18% in current freshman class)
- → 19% underrepresented minorities
- → 50% Iowa residents





Class experience

- → Lecture classes are in the College of Nursing building in active learning-style classrooms
 - 84 students
- → Laboratory style classes are in the Nursing Clinical Education Center
 - University of Iowa Health Care
 - 8 students per group
- → Clinical courses
 - The majority are at University of Iowa Health Care
 - 4-8 students per clinical group
 - Some clinicals are in the community and other agencies







Partnerships for BSN students

- → University of Iowa Health Care
- → 35 clinical agencies
 - Cedar Rapids, Des Moines
 - Community Health Agencies such as Johnson County
 - Long-term care agencies such as Oaknoll
 - Hospice
 - Shelter House, Dream City, Free Medical Clinic, Veterans Affairs, after-school programs...







University of Iowa Health Care

- → Unit Partner program
 - Students have a job at UI Health Care when they arrive on campus
 - Hours are flexible (24 hours per month)
 - Position can evolve into other opportunities
- → Shared Nursing Clinical Education Center (NCEC)
- → Students will also be at UI Health Care Downtown and North Liberty campuses





Student Outcomes

- → First-year retention 97.7%
- → Four-year graduation rate 90.1%
- → Six-year graduation rate 95.8%
 - 97.8% for transfer students
- → 97% employment within 6 months of graduation
- → 96% pass rate on NCLEX
 - National average 94%
 - State of Iowa average 93.47%
- → National average starting salary for RN is \$68,485 (\$52,882 Iowa)





Scholarships


- Number of Scholarship Applications: 436

- \$1,279,040.80 scholarship funding awarded in FY25





Together Hawkeyes UI Campaign

- → UI Campaign
 - Goal \$3 Billion
 - Progress to Goal: \$2.17 billion (72%)
 - As of 6/23/2025 (70.4% time elapsed)
- → College of Nursing Campaign
 - Goal \$70 Million
 - Progress to Goal: \$52.6 million (75%)
 - As of 6/23/2025 (70.4% time elapsed)





What do we want you to know about...

- Career opportunities are endless
 - Variety of specialties: Emergency room, intensive care, neurology, pediatrics, obstetrics, older adult...
 - Variety of careers: insurance companies, pharmaceutical, hospital, forensics, community/public health, health and wellness companies...
- A major reason for the nursing shortage is that the demand for nurses in areas outside the hospital is growing exponentially
- High school preparation
 - Certified nursing assistant is not required, robust science and math preparation is important
- Where do students go to work?
 - 65% residents stay in Iowa and 34% non-residents stay in Iowa







Opportunities for Student Growth

Research and Scholarship

- Young Nurse Scientist Program
- Selected students are paid to work on an independent research project with faculty
- Volunteer research opportunities for students
- The college selects 10 students to present posters at the Midwest Nursing Research Society meeting
- Nursing Honors program





Community Health Practicum in Eswatini

- Fulfills one of the BSN/RN-BSN program's required courses
- Senior year/final semester
- 12 students with two faculty spend the semester focused on learning about community health in Eswatini
- Two weeks spent over Thanksgiving/Spring Break in Eswatini
- Code family need-based scholarships











Other opportunities:

- → American Association Colleges of Nursing Student Policy Summit
- → Interprofessional education with other health science students
- → Young clinician programs: Pediatrics, Community, Gerontology
- → Student representatives on college committees: curriculum committee, student affairs committee
- → Student representatives to numerous college events
- → Participation in the mobile clinic





Unique internships

- Mother Prybil Summer Internships in Adult Intensive Care, The College of Nursing Neuroscience Summer Internship, and Sharon Devine Heiple Nursing Internship are paid summer internships at UI Health Care
 - Students work side-by-side with a preceptor
 - 40 hours for 10 weeks
 - Preceptor awarded travel to a professional conference
 - If intern takes a position at UI Health Care post-graduation, they will also receive a professional conference in first year of employment






Health Professions Shortage Areas: Mental Health, April 2025
